## Assessment: Calculus Lab, Math 235

As you get ready to do an assessment of the course, please recall the course objectives:

The two main goals of this course are to (1) learn mathematics software (Maple), especially in the context of solving specific problems, and (2) learn how to write mathematics using LaTeX (which includes typesetting commands). Additionally, we want to foster your ability to work in groups.

For the grading, I will sum the scores you have received on your 6 labs.

Additionally, I ask that each of you send me an email rating the lab partners that you have had this semester (see the list on the class website if you've forgotten). You simply need to give each person a number score (from 0 to 4, like a GPA- but do round off your answers). If you feel compelled, you may also give an explanation, but that is not necessary. Think about what we said in the syllabus:

It is your responsibility to make sure that your partner contributes fairly to the project, and remember that you will be assessed by how well you are working together- For example, you should: Arrive on time, be ready to go when you do arrive, be ready to help (willing to do a fair share of the workload), and be willing to schedule off-hour meetings.

The overall average each person gets will be translated into a 10 point scale, so the overall number of points possible for the course will be 110. The individual ratings will be kept *confidential*, but I will share the summary statistics with each person.
