This course satisfies the Quantitative Analysis distribution requirement. A goal of such courses is to *Perform computations associated with a model and make conclusions based on the results*. For us, this means being able to successfully solve certain kinds of problems, applied in some sense, often "word problems". Many of the exercises, quiz problems, and exam problems will be of this type. By the end of the course, you should be able to successfully solve a variety of problems of this type.
