

## Presentation Rubric

The following are general guidelines to follow when assessing an oral presentation. For each, give a score of 1, 2 or 3 (3-Highest).

- Speaker's name and topic:
- Organization/Presentation: (Circle one)
  - 3: Information presented in a logical flow. Board work is easy to follow. No grammatical/spelling errors.
  - 2: Some jumping around. Board work mostly complete.
  - 1: No sequence of information/lots of spelling errors.
- Eye Contact: (Circle one)
  - 3: Occasionally checks notes, but mostly not.
  - 2: Reads a lot- infrequent eye contact.
  - 1: Reads all the time- no eye contact.
- Elocution/enthusiasm.
  - 3: Clear voice, loud enough to hear. Has strong positive feelings for subject.
  - 2: Voice is low, but shows positive feelings about topic.
  - 1: Infrequently speaks- mostly writes on the board in silence. No interest in topic.
- Content- The Rule of Three: This means that topics are presented in multiple ways- In words, in algebra and graphically.
  - 3: Content clear, uses examples.
  - 2: Could have used more examples, or mostly clear.
  - 1: Content not at all clear.
- Knowledge
  - 3: Seems very at ease and demonstrates understanding.
  - 2: Sometimes uncomfortable; can answer questions.
  - 1: Unable to answer questions, does not have a good grasp of the information.
