The Grammar Rules of Lingua-X

To succeed, you must apply these patterns consistently:

- **Word Order:** Verb – Subject – Object (e.g., "Sees John ball").
- **Plurals:** Add the suffix *-li* to nouns (e.g., "appleli").
- **Adjectives:** Must follow the noun and end in *-lo* (e.g., "apple redlo").
- **Negation:** Place the word **No** at the very beginning of the sentence.

- **Runu:** Runs
- **Supa:** Eats
- **Baka:** Book
- **Munda:** Apple
- **Pina:** Green
- **Vela:** Fast
