

Evaluations: Calculus II (Spring 2002)

To save on space, I have compiled the questions on one sheet- you may use your own paper to give as long or as short an answer as you'd like.

1. When did you take Calc I (and where if not at Whitman)? Did it give you sufficient preparation for Calc II?
2. What was the reason you took this course?
3. Did you take advantage of office hours? If not, why not? If so, was our meeting time convenient for you, and did you get enough help?
4. Did you go to the Calculus tutors for help? If not, why not? If so, did you have a good experience with them?
5. Do you feel there is enough help available to you outside of class?
6. Were the weekly quizzes a fair assessment of the previous week's homework (both in terms of content and grading)?
7. Were the exams a fair assessment of the material (again in terms of content and grading)?
8. Were the sample exam questions sufficient preparation for the exams?
9. Was the workload for this course consistent with your other courses?
10. Were the lectures clear? Would you have preferred some other form of pedagogy (like group work, discovery learning, daily homework)?
