1. COURSE INFO: Math 126, Calculus II. Section C meets Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 9-10AM in Olin 211. Section F meets on the same days, from 11-Noon in Olin 210.
2. TEXT: Calculus, Early Transcendentals. By James Stewart. Note that this is a NEW VERSION, the 4th Edition. Earlier editions may be significantly different. We will be covering Chapters 5-8, and perhaps part of 9 this semester. See the preliminary calendar, attached.
3. Grading Criteria.
  - (a) HOMEWORK: Homework will be due each Thursday, covering the previous Tuesday, Thursday, and Monday work. For example, on Jan 27, the HW from Sections 2.6, 4.10 and Appendix E will be due. You may ask questions about the homework on any day *except the day that it is due*. You need turn in only those problems that have an asterisk, but you should try to work through all assigned homework to be ready for the exams and quizzes. Homework is graded on a 4-point scale: 4.0=A, 3.0=B, 2.0=C, 1.0=D, 0=F. The homework will account for 20% of your total grade.
  - (b) EXAMS: We will have three exams and a final exam. The exam dates will be: **Thursday, February 17, Thursday, March 9,** and **Thursday, April 20**. These dates will not change, so make your plans appropriately (especially for Spring Break). The final will be administered at the regularly published time, and, as usual, will be comprehensive. The exams will account for 70% of the

overall grade. Thus, each exam will account for 17.5% of the grade. If you score well on the Final, your lowest exam grade will be replaced by the average of that grade with the Final.

- (c) QUIZZES: Starting Tuesday, January 25, at the beginning of each session, we will have a short (1-5 minute) quiz over the previous day's material. Be sure to be on time every day! These quizzes cannot be made up. I will drop the two lowest scores. Quizzes will total 10% of your overall grade.

Grading:

90-100%=A, 80-89%=B, 70-79%=C, 60-69%=D, 59 and below=F

I will use the plus/minus grading only sparingly in those borderline cases.

- 4. Collaboration: You are encouraged to discuss homework assignments with other students and you should form study groups. However, you need to be sure that you understand the homework problems, as they will be the basis for the quizzes and exams.
- 5. Help! I encourage you to come see me. If you can't make it during office hours, either email me if you have short questions, or make an appointment.
- 6. Academic Honesty. Academic standards will be *strictly* adhered to as outlined in the College's policies. This means that cheating will not be tolerated. Looking at another student's exam or quiz (whether or not you mean to copy answers) while taking it will be considered cheating. Please don't test this policy!
