The Last Lab: Oral Presentation in Beamer

For the last project of class, we will be building and presenting a short talk using Beamer (length: About 3 minutes per speaker).

For our next session, you will "grade" each talk (use +, \checkmark , -) in each of four categories:

- Slides: Is the typesetting good (margins, spacing, figures, etc)?
- Speaking: Is the speaker loud and clear?
- Material: Was the material presented in a way that made it look interesting or useful?
- Overall: General impression, including timing (about 3 minutes each).

I will also use the same categories in assigning points (5 points per category for a total of 20 points possible). My score will also take into account your PDF and tex files that you'll upload to CLEO. The class grades will account for approximately 40% of the final score.

Some notes about giving a good presentation:

- Do not simply read your slides. Include enough information so that you recall what details to fill in, but the slides themselves should be "clean".
- Playing with "frills" (like flying bullet points) might be fun, but they tend to be distracting.
- Our talks will be short, so focus on just one or two important topics/examples that you want the audience to remember later.
- Be sure to give references, where appropriate.

Once the talks are over, please remember to:
